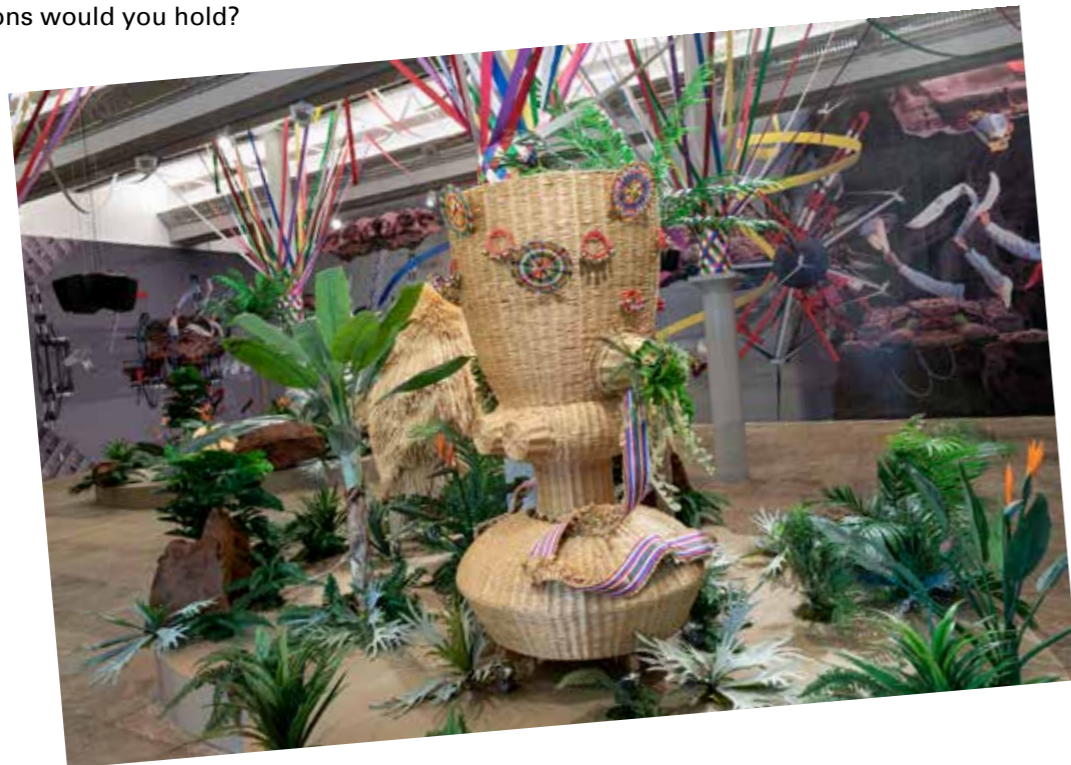
- ✳ Did you know? The Walker House building located here has a reinforced bunker that was used as an important command centre during WW2.

#### Trail 1: Up the Hill

##### Victoria Gallery & Museum

- Can you find the anatomical plant models? Choose a plant model and keep it a secret. Get your friends and family to guess which one you chose by asking you questions. You can only answer yes or no! Try asking questions like “does it have a red flower?” or “does it have any prickles?”



##### Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral

- \* Did you know? Architect Frederick Gibberd’s design for this amazing building was chosen when he won a worldwide competition in 1959.
- Can you spot the benches made by Ryan Gander and children from Knotty Ash Primary School? In how many ways can you use the benches?
- Can you name any of the shapes used to make the benches? You could come up with your own names for the irregular ones!
- All the shapes can also be found on the Cathedral. Can you spot where each shape comes from? How many can you find?
